## Apply for financial aid!

You must complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) **each year** to apply for all federal student aid, most state aid, and some institutional aid. The quickest way to apply is online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).

Our Financial Aid Office uses information from the FAFSA to determine if you are eligible to receive federal student aid from grants, loans, and work-study programs. Now is the time to take action! Meet Malone's **March 1<sup>st</sup> filing deadline** to avoid being locked out of funds with limited availability.

### Steps for applying for aid:

- If you have not done so already, apply for a U.S. Department of Education personal identification number (PIN) at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). The PIN will allow you to electronically sign your FAFSA and make any necessary corrections online. **Your parent must also apply for his or her own PIN** to sign electronically.
- Use the FAFSA on the web worksheet that can be printed from [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). This worksheet will help you collect the necessary information.
- Complete and submit the online FAFSA at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). **Make sure you receive a confirmation number.**
- Your application will be processed and you will receive an e-mail with a link to your Student Aid Report (SAR). Review your SAR for any necessary corrections.
