## **Key Strength #1: Review and Retention Rubric Results**

PLO: Students will demonstrate characteristics related to the domains of clinical astuteness, intrapersonal skills, interpersonal skills, and professional and ethical practice in counseling.

94.71% of Malone counseling students passed the Review and Retention Rubric assessment, scoring higher than 2 on a 0-6 scale, for Fall 2021, Spring 2022, and Summer 2022.

# Key Strength #2: PO-01/KPI-01

PLO: Students will demonstrate their acquired knowledge of professional counseling identity, roles, advocacy strategies, and skill in the application of professional principles and ethical standards of counseling practice.

This PLO is assessed with a variety of key assessments including: COUN 544 Supervising Clinical Counselor Interview Paper (Pass Rate: 96.27% Fall, 100% Spring, 83.33% Summer); History & Current Issues Paper (Pass Rate: 92.59% Fall, 100% Spring, 100% Summer); COUN 662 Case Study Analysis 2 (Pass Rate: 94.44% Fall, 100% Spring, 100% Summer); COUN 630 Case Conceptualization Paper (Pass Rate: 91.3% Fall, 95.45% Spring, 92.3% Summer). All key assessments met above the 80% threshold we use in our program.

## **Challenges in Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs)**

#### **NCE Pass Rate:**

PLO: Students will meet standards and requirements for state licensure and certifications. Students will pass the clinical mental health counseling licensure exam, the NCE.

This year students struggled to pass the NCE with a 65% pass rate as opposed to last year at 90%.

#### **Action Steps to Respond to Key Challenges**

- 1. Provide assistance to students who do not pass on the first attempt by encouraging students to reach out to professors for support
- 2. Encourage students to review study resources and provide students access to trainings that help students pass the NCE
