## Substitutions and Exemptions

- Credits can be secured by examination for some general education courses. Arrangements for examinations may be made through the Center for Student Success.
- Incoming students with an ACT math score > 24 (SAT math > 580) are exempt from MATH/PSYC 140 unless the course is required in their programs of study.
- MATH/PSYC 140 can be satisfied by taking BUS 240 - Statistics for Business or MATH 150- Precalculus if required by a major/minor program of study.
