Dr. Gregory Miller Inaugurated as Malone's Fourteenth President

Gregory J. Miller, a professor of history at Malone University, officially began his term as the fourteenth president of Malone University on July 1, 2022. Several members of the History, Philosophy, and Social Sciences Department were involved in the Inauguration and Homecoming Weekend festivities on October 14 and 15, 2022. Dr. Jay Case introduced President Miller during the Installation Ceremony, **Dr. Jacci Stuckey '77** co-chaired the Inauguration Weekend Committee and chaired the Installation Ceremony Committee, and HPSS students **Rebekah Stranger '23** and **Seneca Ransom '23** read selected passages from the bible at the installation. Dr. Beer hosted the HPSS alumni gathering on October 15.

Dr. Miller first arrived at Malone in 2000 and specialized in European history, also teaching "World Religions" and "Islam and the West." He served as HPSS department chair for three years and is a two-time recipient of Malone's annual Distinguished Faculty Award for Teaching. He also received the Malone's Distinguished Faculty Award for Scholarship.

Before his appointment as President of Malone University, Dr. Miller also served as an associate provost and as provost at Malone. His wife, Darla Miller, is an adjunct in Spanish at Malone University. Congratulations, Dr. Miller!

Thesis Presentation

Rebekah Stranger '23, an Integrated Social Studies and Integrated Language Arts double major, became the latest in a number of HPSS majors who successfully defended and presented an Honors Thesis. Bekah submitted a tripartite thesis: a research essay on Chinese-American missions and schools in San Francisco, a novel based on a Chinese American girl living in San Francisco at the turn of the last century and based on the American Girl series template, and hand-designed and crafted clothing for an American Girl doll. An avid reader as a child, Bekah was enamored with the American Girl historical novels. However, there has never been a



novel based on a Chinese American girl—until now. Dr. Stuckey served as Bekah's thesis adviser and Drs. Hannah Kroonblawd and Cherie Parsons of the English Department rounded out Bekah's thesis defense committee.
