Substitutions and Exemptions

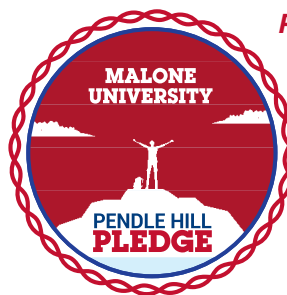
- Credits can be secured by examination for some general education courses. Arrangements for these examinations may be made through the Center for Student Success.
- Incoming students with an ACT math score > 24 (SAT math > 580) are exempt from MATH/PSYC 140 unless the course is required in their programs of study.
- MATH/PSYC 140 can be satisfied by taking BUS 240 - Statistics for Business or MATH 150 - Precalculus if required by a major/minor program of study.

Advanced Options

- Completing the THEO 201/331/332 sequence fulfills the THEO 211 requirement.
- Completing the MUS 371 and MUS372 sequence fulfills the Fine Arts requirement.
- Engaging the Created Order can be fulfilled by one of the following: BIOL 131, BIOL 132, BIOL 144, BIOL 172, CHEM 115, CHEM 131, or PHYS 213

English Proficiency Requirements

Students must be enrolled at the appropriate level of ENG 120 - Elements of English or ENG 145 - English Composition, and then ENG 200 - Literature in Society each semester until the sequence is completed. Students are placed into ENG 120 if the ACT English score < 15 and the overall high school gpa is below 3.0.



Pendle Hill Experiential Learning Requirement

NEW for students entering Fall 2020 (pending approval)

Each traditional undergraduate will engage in experiential learning in one of the following areas: internship, research, service-learning, or off-campus study. Requirement is met by completing at least 2 credit hours of a course with a PH-EL designation. Talk
